The most prestigious award the Chamber gives each year is for Hall of Fame. It always goes to an individual who has made a positive impact on the betterment of community in which he or she lives and who is a supporter of the Chamber of Commerce. Leonard Fitch fits that bill completely and much, much more.

How do you describe someone that is consistently described as "the most generous and kindest person in Wilmore?" There is not enough time to list all the acts of kindness and areas of service in which he has served. Most residents of the county know him as a Wilmore City Councilman for 38 years, owner and operator of Fitch's IGA and the "go to" person for people in need. Leonard is the husband to Emily, father of four, grandfather of eleven.

Jessamine Chamber Honors Wesley Village as Business of the Year 2009

The Jessamine County Chamber of Commerce Outstanding Business of the Year Award for 2009 went to Wesley Village, Kentucky's first full-service Continuing Care Retirement Community.

Opening their doors in June of 1995 with twelve patio homes and twenty-eight "pioneer residents" eager to move in, Wesley Village has been working hard ever since to keep up with the increasing demand for high-quality/affordable senior living options in Central Kentucky.

By 1998, sixty-six patio homes were completed and filled. With the help of Representative Bob Damron and Senator Tom Buford, forty state-of-the-art residential-style apartments for licensed personal care and skilled nursing services were built between the years of 1999 and 2000. In May of 2003 the Lexington Herald-Leader declared the services and accommodations of Wesley Village to be a "new model of care" for the rest of the state.

Again, with the help of local officials including Mayor Harold Rainwater and Judge Neal Cassity, The Wilmore Senior Community Center at Wesley Village was officially opened in June of 2006 as a "warm and inviting place for area residents to gather for the best of life's enriching activities" including free musical concerts, fine dining, worship, movie nights, exercise, "Wii bowling," creative writing classes, computer instruction, arts and crafts, library services and a meeting place for Lions, Women's Clubs, Gideons and more. Many of you have attended wedding, birthday and anniversary celebrations there, too!

Over the years Wesley Village has been first in the Bluegrass to offer independent living patio homes, residential health care apartments, a complete continuum of care through skilled nursing services, and a senior community center made possible by a creative public/private partnership. In the near future, Wesley Village hopes to again stay on the cutting edge by being first in Kentucky to offer the latest in "small homes" for long-term health and memory care to a whole new generation of Baby Boomer consumers.

Wesley Village is a not-for-profit ministry affiliated with United Methodist churches across Kentucky, who together have given back over a half million dollars of Benevolent Care for residents who outlive and exhaust their own financial resources.

With 100 employees and 140 seniors currently in residence from all across the Commonwealth and 22 different states, Wesley Village continues to find new and innovative ways to be of service to Wilmore, Jessamine County, our region, our state, and beyond. Dr. Fleser is a reader, plays piano for his private enjoyment, and schedules a weekly game night with daughters Diana and Jenny. Son Ryan of Minneapolis is just too far away to join the weekly fun.

U.S. Rep. Ben Chandler paid a visit to the Wilmore Fire Department to present a \$43,820 grant for new equipment for the department. The grant, which was written by former Chief Jeff Anderson, is to purchase nine sets of personal protection equipment, breathing tanks as well as new training materials for firefighter classes. The grant came as a 95% to 5% match - the department paid \$2,191, and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security allocated \$41,629.
