## **Congratulations, Wilmore Water Department!**

On April 28<sup>th</sup>, the City of Wilmore was recognized by the Kentucky Division of Water as one of thirty-one plants in the state for the 2008 reporting year that “demonstrated success in producing drinking water that consistently meets or exceeds water quality standards”.

A press release from the Division of Water indicated there were “31 among 155 public and private water treatment plants in the state that participated in the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency’s Area-Wide Optimization Program (AWOP), which challenges plants to reduce turbidity levels below those required by the state and federal regulations. Sand and dirt, as well as bacteria and viruses can cause turbidity, or cloudiness of water. Particle removal is critical for producing water free from dirt and microbes that can cause waterborne diseases.”

The Division of Water initiated the program and began collecting data in July 2006. Participation in the AWOP program is voluntary and the City began participating at the program’s inception.

The AWOP goal is to keep filter turbidity less than .1 NTU more than 95% of the time. In 2006 our percentage was 93.7. In 2007 our percentage was 97.3 and in 2008 our percentage was 96.1.

Certainly credit for this level of water quality goes mostly to a keen treatment plant staff. New monitoring and measuring improvements that were a part of our \$4.5 million water treatment plant upgrade in 2002 have given our staff the information resources to refine our treatment processes.

Operators Bob Moore, Lead Operator James Zweifel, Operations Manager Mike LaSage, and Chris Reeves do a fantastic job of providing excellent drinking water to the Greater Wilmore community, and we are very grateful!

## **Community Service Center of Wilmore - High Bridge Spotlights Volunteer Paul Evely**

Retired after working at Chrysler in Detroit for 33 years, Paul Evely moved first to Florida, then to Kentucky. He volunteers with the Community Service Center Lunch Bunch and is known for his kindness to his neighbors.

Chad Evely, Paul Evelys' grandson wrote the following tribute:

I have countless memories of Grandpa helping others. In Florida, he used to drive people to and from eye appointments. He'd help his neighbors if they weren't feeling well by walking to the local grocery store and shopping for them. When he discovered rust-proof screws, he replaced every single screw in his aluminum mobile home and then did the same for several neighbors, one screw at a time. He has helped more people move than I can count, no matter how sore it made him the next day. Whenever my family moved, he always grumbled about how many books my dad had, but that never stopped him from carrying the heaviest boxes.

He's the kind of guy who, if you mention you're going to be unable to watch the UK game over the weekend, will have VHS in hand with the game the next time you see him. He delivers food to those in need. When his neighbor had a hanging limb that she was afraid would fall on her house, he called up his grandchildren and within the week was calling out commands as we pulled it down.

He stocks the soda machines at IGA and just generally helps out whenever they need him. He doesn't do it for the money, nor does he do it for appreciation. He does it because he knows it will help someone, and that's all the motivation he needs.

I could come up with instance after instance where he puts the welfare of others in front of his own. He loves people and he loves helping people. He doesn't really have hobbies, as most people do. His hobby has always been helping and talking to people, and it's what he does best.

The Community Service Center of Wilmore-High Bridge would like to express appreciation to the Wilmore postal workers for their efforts with the annual postal food drive. Special thanks to Steve Dumais for coordinating this event each year. The food pantry received 2 truckloads of food from this drive. We would also like to thank the community for being so generous in their giving.
