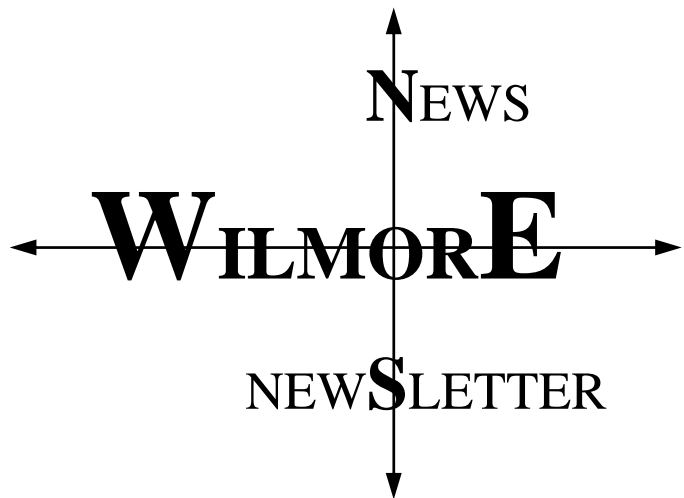

JD Crowe is Jessamine County's world-renowned Bluegrass musician. Several years ago, his dear friend, Judge Wm. Neal Cassity decided that a Bluegrass festival should be started in his honor. The rest is history. The festival has grown to attract many followers who come to Wilmore annually to enjoy great Bluegrass music. JD is a humbled Grammy-winner musician, also known as "The Master of the 5-String Banjo." JD has perhaps been a mentor to several other Bluegrass talents such as Allisan Kraus, Ricky Skaggs, and Keith Whitley. This year's festival line-up, includes Sonny Osborne, The Lonesome River Band, The Grascals, and the local and very funny and popular musical comedy act of The Moron Brothers.

The festival is for the entire family. Thursday evening starts with a Bean Supper. There are Bluegrass Music Workshops offered for students and adults, jamming in the parking lot, too!

The Crowe Fest '09 offers world-class entertainment at family-friendly prices. Festival features, include the Vintage Car Display, Kids Zone Inflatables, and Archery Demonstrations. Kids under 12 are free with adult admission, and Student Weekend Passes are just \$10. Weekend passes are \$30 in advance and \$45 at the gate. Friday admission: \$15/\$25, and Saturday: \$20/\$30. RV camping: \$45 minimum. More than three nights: additional \$10 per night. Reservations are required. Primitive camping: FREE.

New Ministry in Town: Confrontation Point

Have you been wondering what sort of business has moved in near the corner of Lexington Avenue and Linden Street? Founded in Tennessee in 1980, Confrontation Point Ministries is a Christian organization that combines service and adventure. This summer, 50 youth groups from over 20 different states will have served with us throughout Kentucky and Tennessee! Groups choose from four trip designs: Home Repair, Mystery Trip, Wilderness Adventure or Creation Restoration.

Home Repair trips provide home renovations for low-income residents in rural counties. Mystery Trips connect participants with urban service agencies where they provide hands-on support. All of the trips have at least one day of adventure activities, but Wilderness Adventure emphasizes team development with a full week in the outdoors. Our newest service trip, Creation Restoration addresses environmental problems by involving youth in conservation of the natural environment.

Andy Bathje, the Executive Director, has been a Wilmore resident for 10 years, working primarily at Asbury College. As a mobile ministry which bases programming in state parks and local campgrounds, it was decided to move the headquarters to Wilmore in order to better recruit summer counselors, partner with local ministries and connect employees with a supportive community.

The summer staff stay at the Wilmore Campmeeting grounds. Some service projects are as far as Corbin or Knoxville, but we also provide volunteers at places like the Catholic Action Center in Lexington. In fact, there will be one full week of service projects here in Jessamine County with a group from Richmond, Virginia.

While we serve people in need, our main purpose is to challenge youth to grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ, deepen their trust in others, develop practical skills and appreciate creation. We welcome you to get to know us more and are already grateful to many of you who have assisted in countless ways!
