Alice Snow Becomes a Wilmore Centurion!

Alice Newton Snow was born in McClure, Illinois on October 15, 1909 as one of five children. She went to college for two years and moved into Wilmore in the 1940's. She has three children, Paul Hillman of Louisiana, Jane Stoneback of New York and Mary Elliot who lives in Wilmore. Mrs. Snow worked as a bookkeeper for Asbury Seminary for 37 years. For many years, she was very active in the Methodist Church. Her family is very close knit and includes not only her 3 children, but 3 grandchildren, 11 great grandchildren and 5 great, great grandchildren. Mrs. Snow loved to play Scrabble and crossword puzzles until her vision grew dim. She loved playing the piano, too. She is an avid fan of UK basketball and to this day spends her days watching a lot of TV and welcoming family and friends who visit her at her Wesley Village apartment. She lived independently in her own home in Wilmore until she was 94 years old! She stated that her greatest accomplishment in life was raising good children who are doing well. Her favorite time of year is Spring because it brings new life. If she could do anything she wanted, whenever she wanted, she said "I would want to help others!" This amazing lady has lived a century full of changes and adventures and yet she still has a servant's heart.

A celebration her 100th birthday took place on October 15, 2009 at Wesley Village. Those in attendance included 60 plus guests including family, old friends and residents of Wesley Village. Mrs. Snow knew so many of those attending and was so grateful they came to share her moment in Wilmore history. The Mayor, Harold Rainwater, presented her with the Key to the City and a dozen yellow roses and proclaimed her birthday as Alice Snow Day in Wilmore. She was also written in the Wilmore records as being a Wilmore Centurion. After music and singing and a family written poem was read, a huge cake, ice cream and punch was served. Mrs. Snow was the last one to leave the party. In her apartment she was glowing as she sat and opened each card and read them with smiling eyes! Happy Birthday to Alice Snow of Wilmore!
